About IBANGS

The International Behavioural and Neural Genetics Society was established in 1996 to promote and facilitate the growth of research in the field of neural behavioral genetics. The

society has members worldwide that study the genetic basis of a wide range of behaviors and brain disorders together with the underlying neuronal mechanisms using diverse species, genetic approaches, and techniques in molecular and behavioral neuroscience . The long term goal is to elucidate the molecular pathways through which genes together with the environment affect behavior.

For more than 20 years the annual meeting has attracted 100-150 participants drawn from multiple countries and includes a scientific program of plenary lectures, symposia, selected talks, and poster sessions. Venue information

The Woods Hole Marine Biological Laboratory (MBL) is a world renowned research and teaching facility founded in 1988 as a private, nonprofit institution and is an affiliate of the University of Chicago. The MBL consists of a vibrant and versatile community of approximately 250 year-round employees, about half of which are scientists and scientific staff. The MBL is joined each year by more than 500 scientists, summer staff, and research associates from hundreds of institutions around the world, as well as a large number of faculty and students participating in MBL courses. The nearby cities of Boston MA, Providence RI, and New Haven CT, and the surrounding New England towns have a large concentration of research and educational institutions

In addition to the rich scientific environment, there is a wealth of touristic and recreational activities such as beaches, coastal hikes, biking, salty restaurants and pubs and the of point of departure for the ferry to Martha's Vineyard and Nantucket Islands.

The Genes, Brain and Behaviour, 2020 Annual Meeting will be held at the MBL conference facility which has ample exhibit and meeting space (shown in the photos below) and is ideal for conferences such as ours. It features state-of-the-art broad band wireless capability and audio/visual equipment to ensure that the meeting is a success. Housing and meals will be provided onsite.



The exhibitor tables are set up around the same area as the poster sessions. This area is located in the Swope Conference Center and is on the 2nd floor outside of the main dining room. Tables are provided for exhibitors with chairs and options for electricity. Tables are typically 6'x2' and other table sizes available on campus if needed.
